JOB DESCRIPTION

PURPOSE:

- To strengthen the use and love of practical Christianity through an abundance of wholesome, joyous horse activity.
- To learn & support the CedarS CampS riding program.
- To develop horsemanship skills.

NOTE: WIT's must be able to follow instructions, contribute effectively, be respectful and work well with others.

AGE REQUIREMENT: Entering 9th grade and up

Of WITS: Maximum of 3 girls and 3 boys per session for Sessions 1 & 1.1 and 4 & 4.1.

TIME FRAME: 1 – 4 Weeks (Within CEDARS CAMPS Sessions)

COST: \$700 per week or \$1400 per 2-week session
